The monthly meeting of the Keedysville Water Commission was called to order at pm, with the following members present: Commission Chairman Barry Levey, Commission Members Ken Lord, Judy Kerns, Matt Hull and Brandon Sweeney and Town Administrator Rick Bishop

Minutes for August, 2020 were approved.

General Fund Report was \$243,949.60.

Mr. Levey noted that the Antietam Waterline Replacement and Extension project has begun.

Mr. Levey noted that only two bids were received for the Treatment Plant Gate and Fence project. Mr. Hull made a motion to accept the bid from Frederick Fence Co. Ms. Kerns seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Lord gave an update on the Water Advisory Board meeting. Mr. Hull noted that concern was expressed by a Boonsboro rep about why the work on the spring weir wall was a shared cost.

Mr. Levey resigned as Assistant Mayor & Water Commissioner.

Meeting adjourned at 8:06 pm.
